Day zero is the first day of symptoms or the day of the lateral flow test result - whichever is earlier.

You should wear an FFP3 mask until day 14, after day 14 a surgical mask should be worn. RESUME DOING LATERAL FLOW TESTS TWICE WEEKLY AFTER DAY 14.
